

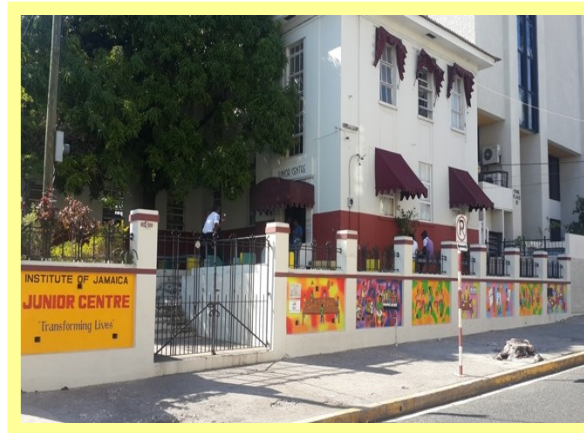


Did you Know?

Reference Services

Facilitate/ Support for Education and Research

The Library houses a collection of reference books that caters to research and education. These include Magazines, Newspaper Clippings, Encyclopedias, Journals, Dictionaries and some text books.

Loan Services

For the encouragement of reading in young children.

Our loan services are open to children ages 6-18 years; all that is required, is membership to the Library. This membership is free of cost. Members of the library may borrow up to two (2) items for take out. A maximum of two weeks is given for items that can be taken out for loan. A fee of \$10.00 per day will be charged for books returned after the due date stamped in book, upon borrowing.

SERVICES continued

Computer Services

To facilitate learning, education and entertainment in a technological era.

Computer service is available to the public for Internet access and Microsoft office applications. Printing, Scanning and photocopying may also be done at a cost.

General Rules

The following things are not allowed in the Library: -

- 1.) Food or drink
- 2.) Playing
- 3.) Running
- 4.) Loud talking, noises, etc.
- 5.) Bags
- 6.) Cell phones (if necessary must be on silence)
- 7.) All users of the Library must be properly attired. Absolutely no sleeveless, short shorts/ skirts or tights are allowed.
